#### LEVERAGING TELEHEALTH TO IMPROVE AGING IN PLACE

The impact of the pandemic has been profound on the expansion of home telehealth and the integration of health technology in the home. Relatedly, the preference to age in place continues to climb with an additional 30 million more Medicare beneficiaries by 2030, while the provider and long-term care labor supply declines. This expert panel of diverse stakeholders discusses the growing utilization of home telehealth, along with approaches to improve clinical effectiveness, cost-efficiencies, and greater access to care, while complying with shifting regulations.



## FRAUD & ABUSE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION IN LONG-TERM CARE

Older adults are at risk from the rise of predatory consumer practices, extending from classic "con-men," sham phone calls, and online scams, to experiencing financial harm in a range of settings, including assisted living and skilled nursing facilities. This panel comprises industry leaders, senior government officials, and expert regulatory and investigatory counsel to discuss the various roles of the government and the public to protect against common threats to an older population, along with sharing best practices and resources.



### AGING WELL FOR ALL

How can we all age well? Expert panelists share the latest information on caring for our future by investing in the current direct care workforce, expanding educational pathways to diversify the profession, and strengthening company culture by driving a vision of diversity, inclusion, and belonging (DI&B). In addition, work around developing and applying the equity standard for older adults in the built environment will be explored. This discussion aims to deepen our understanding of the steps we need to take to better ensure equitable access to resources as we age.
